Volunteer Hour Categories

- Administration of Planning and Maintenance
- Special events (workshops, seminars, OHA AGM and conventions)

- 9. Other (litter pick up- Earth Day)

All program Chairs are to keep the total number of hours for their events. Time spent by members not at an event are to be submitted by that member (community halls, digging up plants in your own garden for the plant sale). Travel time should also be submitted for members travelling to and from events or meetings.
